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

In order to prevent ragging UGC has framed regulation on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions. These regulations are mandatory and all institutions are required to take necessary steps for its implementation in to including the monitoring mechanism as per provisions in the above regulations and ensure its strict compliance. The UGC has also taken several proactive steps including effective launch of Media Campaign for preventing ragging. Films in ragging are also uploaded on UGC website for use by higher education institutions.

As a step flirther, UGC has decided that from this year Anti Ragging Day would be observed on 12th August followed by Anti Ragging Week from 12th August to 18th August. This initiative is one of the tools of the Commission in increasing awareness against ragging.

The Civil Engineering Department has organized an anti-ragging activity session on "Awareness towards - No to ragging" on the 17th of August, 2023 from 10:30-11:30 am in the classroom for B.Tech I, II, and III year students. The session shall be conducted by Dr. Mehali J. Mehta, Head of the Civil Engineering Department; Prof. Zarana H. Gandhi; Prof. Abhishek K. Shinde; and Prof. Chaitali D. Solanki, Faculty of the Civil Engineering Department.

- **Event Details:**

1. **Anti-Ragging Slogan Competition:** The day began with the anti-ragging slogan competition held in the department classroom. The competition was open to all students, and participants were encouraged to create catchy and impactful slogans that would discourage ragging and promote a culture of respect and inclusivity on campus.

The competition was judged by a panel of esteemed faculty members who assessed the slogans based on their relevance, creativity, and potential to drive home the message against ragging. The participants displayed impressive creativity, and the slogans ranged from witty one-liners to thought-provoking statements.

2. **Screening of Anti-Ragging Short Movie:** Following the slogan competition, a short movie on anti-ragging was screened. It also showcased the importance of reporting incidents of ragging and seeking help when needed.




Figure 2: Brief introduction by faculties




Figure 3: Deep discussion of students with each other




Figure 6: Conclusion Explained by faculties




Figure 7: Selective slogans
