Objectives of the Program

- To integrate theoretical knowledge with practical environmental applications.
- To promote environmental awareness and sustainable practices.
- To encourage responsible use of natural resources.
- To instill social, ethical, and ecological responsibility among students.
- To motivate student participation in waste management, recycling, and green initiatives.
- To enhance community outreach and environmental awareness beyond the campus.
- To develop a sustainability-oriented engineering mindset among future civil engineers.

The Earth Week Celebration witnessed enthusiastic participation from the academic community. More than 200 students and over 50 faculty and staff

members actively took part in various activities conducted throughout the week, including outreach visits, workshops, green initiatives, and awareness programs. Their collective involvement contributed significantly to the success and impact of the celebration.

Day-wise Activities

Day 1: Community Outreach – Visit to Eco Farm (22nd April, 2026)

Second- and third-year Civil Engineering students visited an Eco Farm in Surat. The session was guided by **Mr. Snehal Patel**, owner of the Eco Farm, who shared valuable practical insights into eco-friendly living.

The visit to Eco Farm aimed to provide practical exposure to sustainable living and environmentally responsible practices. The farm serves as a model for maintaining ecological balance through organic and resource-efficient methods. It features organic farming plots, composting units, rainwater harvesting systems, and structured waste management practices. A key highlight was the use of solar panels and windmill for harvesting energy. Rainwater harvesting methods showcased efficient water conservation, crucial for urban areas like Surat. The reuse of water by inhouse treatment method by planting trees used tanks placed in series. An organic farming technique, including natural manure, vermicomposting, and bio-fertilizers, ensuring soil health and chemical-free crop production. The farm also demonstrated effective waste management by converting biodegradable waste into nutrient-rich compost, promoting a closed-loop system. Importantly, the farm actively engages in community outreach by spreading awareness, educating visitors, and encouraging sustainable practices among the public. Overall, the visit emphasized the role of such initiatives in fostering environmental responsibility and community participation.

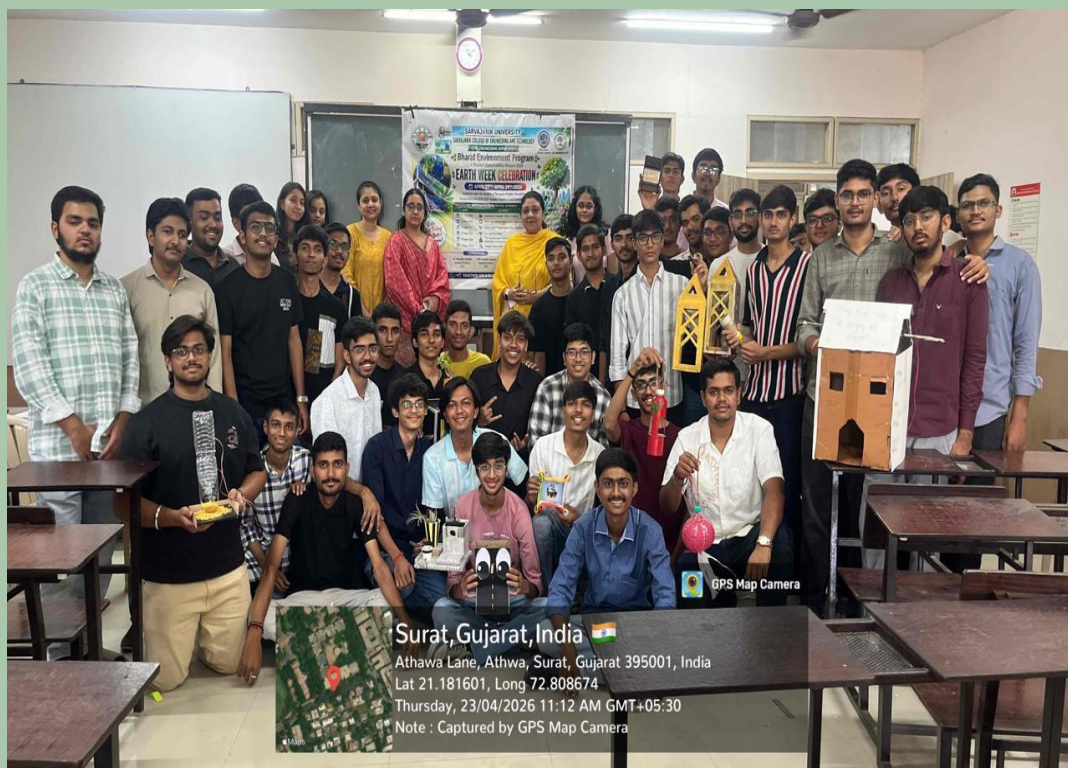
The visit to Eco Farm, Vesu was highly insightful. Such initiatives play a crucial role in building a greener and more sustainable future.

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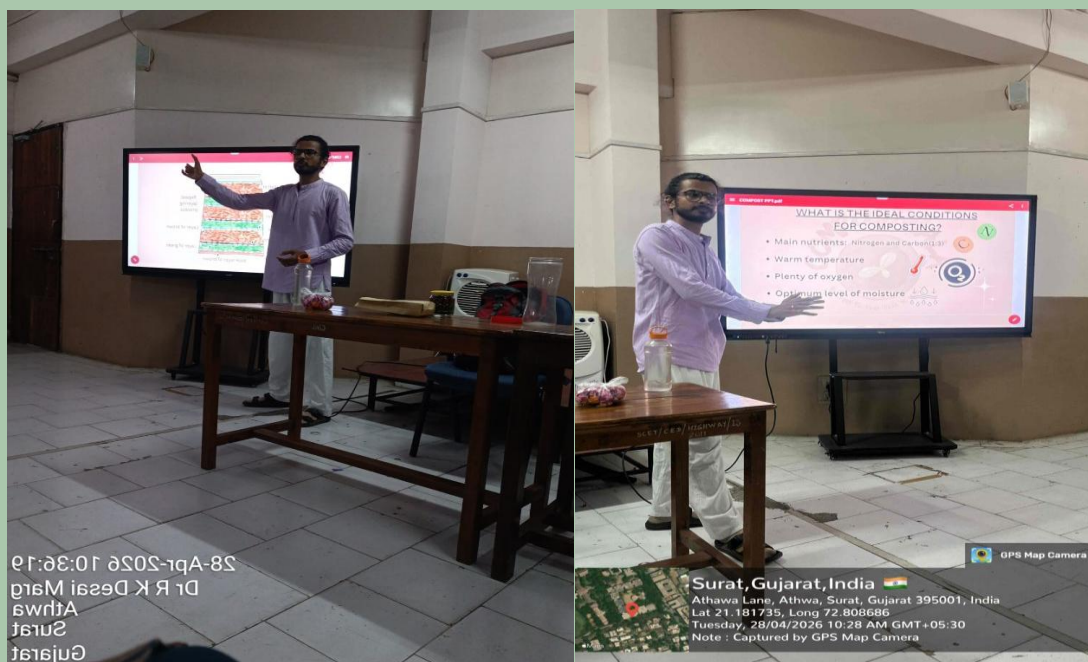
