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About the event:

The T&P committee of EC Department of SCET organised the '**Training and Placement Orientation Program and clearing campus placement**' on 4th September 2023. 51 students from BE IV EC participated in the campus awareness program. The main goal was to orient the aspirants about the vision of the T&P cell, create awareness about campus placement, registration for campus interviews of the companies and job survey to know the number of students interested for job.

- **Vision of the T&P committee of Department and Campus placements:**

Department T&P coordinator, Prof Sarosh Dastoor addressed the program providing the vision of the T&P department and motivated the participants for cracking the campus placements for various companies with their requisites. Prof Sarosh added that the Training and Placement Cell envisions becoming a dynamic and industry-focused hub that empowers engineering students to excel and be sought after by leading organizations nationwide / worldwide. We aspire to establish a seamless bridge between academia and industry, facilitating career growth and fostering innovation for the holistic development of the students. He also addressed the aspirants regarding the requirements of companies and the standard operating procedure for the Campus placements and showed concern about the less registrations for the campus placements. TCS campus clearance and the requisites were demonstrated in details along with the average placement statistics for the last three years.

HOD, Prof Chirag Paunwala motivated the students to enhance their skills, participate in the various workshops, competitions and hence, make them suitable for the campus selection. He also stressed about the requirements of engineers from core branches (EC, EL, Mech, Civil, Chemical, Textile) for IT sector companies and the demand of the industries. Prof Nehal Shah highlighted the students regarding the market demand and efficient role to be played as a student for him/her to be recruited in the company. Prof. Pranav Lapsiwala and Prof Dhiren Bhagat also motivated the students to clear their vision regarding job requirements, further studies or entrepreneurship. It is always a vision that leads to destination.

Departmental student volunteers viz. Ishaq Malam and Sanskruti Patil were requested to shoulder the responsibility for obtaining the job count for the department. Job survey is conducted every year for the final year students to obtain the count about the students interested for job, Post-Graduation and entrepreneurship. Many students interacted with the faculties regarding the eligibility of core branch based companies as well as IT Sector based companies.

They were informed that for majority of IT based companies, CGPA does not matter, only specific skills and zeal to perform the accomplishments will pave the path for high placements.

The Training and Placement Orientation Talk was a resounding success and the outcome could be summarized as: -

- It provided students with a comprehensive understanding of the placement process, industry expectations, and the skills required to secure promising job opportunities.
