Takeaways from the Resume Building Session

Key Elements of a Strong Resume:

- Contact Information: Ensure all contact details are up-to-date and professional.
- **Professional Summary:** A concise summary that highlights key skills and career objectives.
- Work Experience: Detailed with job titles, company names, and dates. Use bullet points to describe responsibilities and achievements.
- Education: List degrees and relevant certifications.
- Skills: Highlight technical and soft skills relevant to the job.
- Additional Sections: Include volunteer work, publications, or awards if relevant.

Best Practices:

- **Tailoring:** Customize the resume for each job application to match the job description.
- Action Verbs: Use strong action verbs like "managed," "developed," "led," etc.
- Quantifiable Achievements: Include metrics to demonstrate the impact of your work (e.g., "Increased sales by 20%").
- Formatting: Keep the layout clean and professional, using consistent fonts and bullet points.

Common Mistakes to Avoid:

- Typos and grammatical errors.
- Including irrelevant information.
- Using an unprofessional email address.
- Making the resume too long or too short.
