



Resolutions

A resolution in Model United Nations (MUN) is a formal document that represents the collective stance of a committee on a given issue. It outlines the problem, discusses solutions, and suggests actions that should be taken. Resolutions follow a structured format, typically consisting of:

- 1. Heading: Includes the committee name, topic, resolution number, and sponsors.
- Preamble: Provides background information on the issue, references past UN resolutions, and justifies the need for action.
- 3. Operative Clauses: Detail the proposed actions, policies, and solutions. These are numbered and usually begin with strong verbs like "Urges," "Calls upon," or "Encourages."

A Resolution Passed in SUMUN, In United Nations General Assembly (UNGA):

AUTHORS: UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION, THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN:

SIGNATORIES: THE STATE OF PALESTINE, PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA. HASHEMITE KINGDOM OF JORDAN, STATE OF ISRAEL, REPUBLIC OF INDIA, SULTANATE OF OMAN:

AGENDA: REVISITING STATE BOUNDARIES IN MIDDLE EAST COUNTRIES WITH EMPHASIS ON INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAWS

Reminding all nations in the 80th session of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which recognizes the inherent dignity, equality, and inalienable rights of all global citizens,

Recalling the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations, particularly the respect for sovereignty, territorial integrity, and the right to self-determination,

Emphasizing the significance of International Humaniturian Law (IHL.), as outlined in the Geneva Conventions and their Additional Protocols, in ensuring the protection of civilians and maintaining peace during conflicts.

Welcoming efforts by the UN and international humanitarian organizations to provide aid and support to affected populations, while stressing the need for long-term solutions to territorial disputes, and encouraging cultural exchange programs to foster mutual understanding and reconciliation.

The United Nation General Assembly,

- Reaffirms the necessity of regionally-led diplomatic initiatives speurheaded by Middle Eastern nations to resolve boundary disputes amicably, free from external coercion or undue interference;
- Cally upon all middle eastern states to ensure that any revision of boundaries is based on mutual consent, thereby safeguarding the sovereignty and territorial integrity of states in the Middle East;
- Condemns all acts of violence, forced displacement, arbitrary detention, and other human rights violations resulting from fictitious boundary demarcations or from attempts to unilaterally alter established borders;
- Encourages all relevant actors to consider measures that facilitate the delivery
 of humanitarian assistance in line with applicable international standards;
- Encourages the development of cultural exchange programs between nations involved in boundary disputes to foster mutual understanding, reduce tensions, and promote peaceful dialogue;
- Urges the establishment of neutral and transparent humanitarian aid corridors
 with full coordination from state authorities, ensuring sovereignty is respected
 while aid is distributed under impartial UN oversight;
- 7. Remain seized of matters.
