### A Brief Report

Sarvajanik College of Engineering and Technology, Surat had organized National level SCET Multidisciplinary Conference on Engineering & Technology (SMDCET-2017).

During inaugural function of this multi conference, Dr. S. R. Gandhi – Director, SVNIT, Surat was invited as a Chief Guest. Dr. U. B. Desai - Director, IIT, Hyderabad and Shri Rajiv Bhatnagar - Director, Hazira facility, ESSAR Steel graced the occasion as Guest of Honour. Immediately after inauguration, keynote address of Dr. U. B. Desai was arranged on "No Smart cities without sensors".

Under this banner, Textile Technology Department had organized National Conference on Innovations with Technical Textile (ITT- 2017) on 25th and 26th March, 2017.

ITT 2017 aims to gather technocrats from different states of India on a common platform and to promote research activities leading towards Innovations with Technical Textiles. ITT 2017 included the following three domains of technical textiles: a) Textiles for Agriculture, Building-construction & industrial applications; b) Textiles for applications in medicine, sports and automobiles and c) Smart textiles, geo textiles and eco textiles.

#### Day 1 (25<sup>th</sup> March 2017, Saturday)

The process of registration of participants for the ITT 2017 for all categories was conducted by Prof. Shweta Doctor at the Textile Technology Department between 09:00 am to 10:00 am. All together, 57 student participants from different colleges of textiles, faculties and scholars from SCET and other surrounding textile colleges as well as some of the participants from nearby textile industries had registered themselves for this conference. As against 40 targeted participants, we could able to register for more than 70 participants for this conference.

The ITT 2017 was started with the talk of learned invited speaker, Dr. Vijay Ramakrishnan, Head, TRADC, Kosamba on 25<sup>th</sup> March 2017. He was warmly welcomed by ITT 2017 Programme Chair - Dr. P. A. Khatwani. Dr. Khatwani introduced our guest.

He addressed the gathering about the technical textiles in general followed by vast scope and future prospectus of textiles apart from apparel industries. He gave full understanding on the fibres which can be used for the same; involving the new fibres available. He ended his talk with the comparison of these new fibres with the conventional fibres. The invited session was further continued by Mr. Amit Dayal, Assistant Vice President, TRADC, Kosamba. He gave through knowledge on recent developments occurring in the segment of sport textiles. He wonderfully explained about moisture management technique in sport wear. He concluded his session with overwhelming discussion with the gathering.

That was a platform for UG, PG and Ph.D. students to share about the research they are currently doing in their research work in the form of paper presentation. Total 8 such quality papers were accepted for presentation after the plagiarism check and by pass standardised process decided centrally. Amongst these 8 papers, 1 paper on medical textile was from UG student of Textile processing department, SCET; 1 paper on industrial textile from an industrialist; 4 papers on various technical textile segments were from ME scholars and 2 papers by Ph.D. scholars. The entire event was evaluated by Dr. Vijay Ramakrishnan – the invited technical session guest for the conference day.

After completion of presentations, Dr. Vijay Ramakrishnan distributed certificates to the participants. The day was ended with the felicitation of Dr. Vijay Ramakrishnan by memento as a token of love followed by vote of thanks to the other industrial attendees as well as all the gathering by Programme Chair – Dr. P. A. Khatwani.

#### **Scholar Session**

After such knowledgeable and practical talk by the invited speakers, Scholar session was arranged which was coordinated by Prof. S. K. Parmar. Students had to prepare the poster in the prescribed size and as per the draft on any of the titles allotted on technical textiles. Students participated in groups of two to present the posters. Total 24 students from various colleges making 12 teams displayed their posters on the said subjects.

The main attraction of the scholar session was the second event i.e. product display. In this event, students had to display the currently available products in the market from the field of technical textiles. Total five such products were kept for display by the students of different colleges. These products included refrigerator pad which can absorb the bad odour and bacteria from the surrounding of the fridge to keep the items fresh and surrounding pleasant;

shoes sole which could absorb perspiration and its bad odour from our feet; laminated jacket which simply scrolled down the water droplet fallen on it, etc. Our principal madam – Dr. Vaishali Mungurwadi, Dean, SAWC – Dr. Mayank Dalal, I/C Registrar, SCET – Mr. Bhaskar Cheruku also visited the place to increase students' enthusiasm. They left the place with happy faces to see such wonderful products and posters displayed by the students.
